Reckon often vvith your Masters, or chapmen, for short reckoning makes long friends. There are many other things doubtless, vvwhich are needful, to be taken care of, vvwhich are not possible for me, to think on: but time and experience vvill teach you them. And think it not strange, if you learn something by shame and loss: for things, so learned usually are best remembred. So hoping, that mine advice to you herein shall not be altogether cast off, I leave you to God and rest,

A Bill

*A Bill of loading (Connossement) after
Dutch manner.*

Shipped by the grace of God in good order,
and vvell conditioned, by Robert Merchant,
in and upon the good ship, called the Palm-
tree, vvhreeof is Master under God, for this
present voyage, James William Goodman, and
novv riding at anker in the Maseby Rotterdam,
and by Gods grace bound for Roan, to say
M: W: ten bales of Russia Leather, being
marked and numbred, as in the margent, and
are to be delivered in the like good order, and
vvell conditioned, at the aforesaid Port of Roan
(the danger of the seas onely excepted) unto
John Liever, or to his assigns, he or they
paying freight for the said goods, five and
twenty Hollands guilders, vvith primage and
avarage accustomed. In vvitness vvhreeof the
Master or Purser of the said ship hath affirmed
to three Bills of Loading, all of this tenor, and
date, the one of vvvhich three Bills being ac-
complished, the other two to stand void. And
so God send the good ship to her desired Port
in safety. Amen. Dated in Rotterdam the 20.
day of January, 1713.

A Dutch Bond or Obligation for money.

Iunderwritten do ackovvledye by these, really
to be indebted to Mr. J. B. the sum of eight
hundred

hundred gilders, for ready money to my content received, by me J. F. B. vvhich said sum of eight hundred gilders I do promise to pay to him, or the shevver hereof vvithout charges, or dammages, at the end of tvelve moneths, precisely after the date hereof vvith the Interest of the same, according to four and a fourth part per cent in the year; untill the full payment. Hereto binding my person and all my goods, none excepted, setting the same upon to the power of all Judges and laws: In witness of the truth whereof I have signed the same with my own hand: Actum in Amsterdam the third of November, in the year sixteen hundred seventy six.

A clearing of an accompt.

THis day the tenth of November. 1712. have we J. C. W. and A. J. A. F. friendly agreed together, and have rekoned from the beginning to the end for certain disbursed moneys, and other things, vvhich L. V. B. demanded, and he remained indebted to me by the end of the account for the sum of 146. gilders, vvhich I ackovvledge to have received; and herewith all our reckonings are dead and annihilated and all that vvas standing out betveen us satisfied. Acted in Amsterdam in the hous of J. V. in presence of J. C. H. and M. K. as vvitnesses, the tenth of November 1712.
