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of the house, that he would consider it as sacred, But he was angry & told me to be quite.

Saturday. April 20. When this Evening I paid a Visit to the Intendant he made an Apologie for the Irregularities of the day before Yesterday, saying, that the dancing Girls should not have come into the Mission house, if he had been at home, & for the future he would effectually prevent it. So different are the Sentiments of this Gentleman from those of the Commissary. His Behaviour was a Comfort to me under my affliction.

Thursday. April 30. Hearing, that the french Troops are to march this Night, I paid my Respects to the General & thanked him for his Attention to my Requests, which ^{to time} from time, I had made in behalf of the poor Inhabitants of Fudalan. Praised be God, our Afflictions are nothing to what they

would have been, if matters had happened to fall out otherwise.
