Tuesday. July 9. Mons. Duchemin, being dangerously ill in Camp, was brought here for the Benefit of his Health. I had the Pleasure of seeing this good Man a good deal recovered.

Monday ^{July} 15. Received a very polite answer from the Admiral Mons. Suffren to a letter which I was advised to write to him.

Saturday. July 20. Was invited to dine with the general Mons. Duchemin & desired to bring the English Surgeon with me that was taken in the Yarmouth. The General's Physicians, who are but little acquainted with the Method of treating such a Patient in this Climate, gave me a full Description of the Rise & progress of the General's disorder & their Method of Curing it in Latin, which they desired me to translate to the English Surgeon who has been long in this Country, expressing a desire to have his Opinion & Advice, They followed his Prescription, & the Patient felt the good Effects of it. But I believe the English Surgeon was not attentive enough; the General ~~repleased~~ ^{repleased}.
