 You will please to remember, that in our last Meeting
 at Lancaster, I took the Liberty to chuse you an
 Arbitrator for my part, concerning the Matter
 depending between me and Mr. Raup, who prevailed
 on the Rev^d Dr. and Provost DeStrangel, to be an
 Arbitrator on his behalve. And whereas it did
 please both the Rev^d Gentlemen, to grant our Request,
 and Mr. Raup has since sent his Complaints to the
 Rev^d Provost, where I have given mine Answer
 unto, I do therefore enreat and beg you Rev^d Sir
 and Brother, to come as soon as possible towards
 Weat, in order to inquire into both our Writings
 and to judge accordingly.

For you know Rev^d Pastor, that Mr. Raup
 did accuse me in the Presence of all the Members
 & of Heterodoxie and β , unchristian Life, and V,
 offered to prove both his Impositions. And this
 is, what by the Law of reason and Revelation, I
 want to have legally proved, and impartially
 decided. And knowing your sacred Regard, both
 for sound Doctrine and Christian Life, I will doubt,
 your unbysed Zeal, will plead for the Innocent,
 and cause the Guilty to repent of their Impudency.
 And tho we have an old Proverb: *Vericus, Vericum*
non decimat, yet shall I endeavour to pay, at least
 the Travelling Charges, and be very glad to see, and
 serve so worthy a Brother in Philadelphia, which is
 the hearty Desire of
 Philadelphia
