29 Apr. 1837. Ant. Ab. Returned from a walk with Karenbalg & Kahnis.
 We are just at the commencement of the summer, I began the 27th. This
 is the time of anxiety about the numbers. When I entered N.W. last
 Thursday, about 40 were present & about 14 had their names taken
 down, this circumstance bid fair for about 100, last sem. the proportion
 was about the same, in the Synagogue I expected rationally about
 60 or 70. Several other things had happened to raise my expectations,
 from many quarters I received notice about my book being well received,
 from Gua today, from Kolshin thro' Petersen, from Bauer in Berlin,
 from old Bunde, from Scheele, from Ullman, Ambricht. Mathias came
 with the commission from the ministers. I had dined with the pro. of
 the sch., received attention from Wille, Madai etc I have been in Berlin
 two weeks ago. My conversation with the prince was excellent with
 respect to his principles, but it appeared to me that he had ausgesprochen
 himself towards me so that nothing remained for a second consultation.
Schulze conversed most friendly & confidentially about my translocation
 to Berlin, kissed me in parting, but he is a filon. In general my relations
 to many people has received a more friendly aspect. Such people like
Twestky, Kohim, Nicol, Draesem who in the year 1830 would have
 shunned me, seem to consider me as one of their own party.

& what is most delightful I can say that I am
candid in every respect, my nature is re-
sistless.

1 May 37 Monday the lectures have begun their regular course, last
week. I depended upon that many more ~~would~~ ^{would} announce
themselves, but when I was kept waiting last ^{of evening} ~~night~~ from 4-5
but had none coming except those whom I knew, Thud perceived
40 & 60 at Geo. & M. & had 26 which grew 31 & this was all &
in Dogn. 22. I tinkered with a cramped hand & there were
in N. 1. half of the bench near the window empty & two benches
behind. This is the smallest number I ever had before in Speyer.
I must now expect the same in Dogn. - Boet told me the father
the student who was worried by an other one not to deliver the lec-
ture but to burn it. This reminded me of old times & they are
returning indeed. Except some three from Götting there is not a single
individual whom I do not know through whom he was introduced
some & not one either from Naumb. or Zeitz or Eisenach - all
these go now to W. again. That is most painful. - After I
had delivered the first lesson there was Missionsschule. There I
found myself once more as in former times comforted & abated
& spoke after Bergers letters were read on the question why
the Lord conducts his people crooked ways.

Tuesday 5 May 37. Yesterday an uninvited, was obliged to go to Luppau
on account of the Donlist, had been there 2 weeks ago with Freid
Birge, Nichtman, Schley, very happy company, they seemed to love
me & to have something christian yet sprightly, yesterday with Thomas
Hanke, the two Kirchner, they were sprightly too but not christian, they
had nothing mystic in their manner of feeling. My affection of
