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I read Dogn & Galates. No one has announced
his name as yet. I shall begin without having
a single name on my list. He wrote today
the likes to the Minists. It is a fortunate cir-
cumstance that his confidence prompts me
to tell him about my salary & about Kremers.
The latter one haunts me properly speaking.

Oh how unworthy of a Christian, I feel I cannot
bear contempt. Yet in conscience one must
be above it, that I can also & will do it.

14 May 38. Have begun today Dognetin, had ^{two} ~~one~~ only on my list, there were ~~perhaps~~
about 20 but some not writing. It is now the hour from 11-5 but one only
whom I do not know has announced his name, the few others are well
known german. At 20 lower ebb I have never come down, as to the
exegetical evenings, which had totally ceased last winter, no one
troubles himself about. Someone came this moment to ask for a
Hebrew Bible, that reminded me of the time when many many
came to call for German Bibles & Testaments. Oh what a sad change.

12 June 38 As to the numbers there remains a sad decrease, there are
now 37 for Dogn on the list, in Galatians 42, in 1 Cor 65 though
as it appears it has not many more, psalm 61 in Synopsi, 22 in
Moral, only 30 has 143 in Archiv. I was most deeply grieved
at it in the beginning, the more so as ^{Lüthy} Richer letter informed
me that the min. had been ready to call him but that
he had declined. In the mean time the plan for building the
house was on the point of being executed. I should have

seized that opportunity most gladly, had not the apprehension
of being left here alone damped my spirits. It was a bright
day when we stood in Antons garden making plans & I was heartily
ready. For the rest I spent about 3 weeks ~~heartily~~ in very good
spirits, a great internal tranquillity, peace with God & mankind,
full faith, last weeks there was a want of quietude, but this
summer I cannot sufficiently disturb them, walked lately with
the 3 Hanoverians, today with Melzius from Bornum, in the evening
with Weissenborn from Mexlenb., & for intercourse there is also a
great number Weise from Eisleben, Albrecht fr Weissenf., Bolz from Mersb.,
Paalz from Potm. etc. Yesterday with Schwarz from Grossw. with
whose conversations I am truly delighted. Oh how delightful
it would be to have him at my side, but providence seems to
leave me without any support. I humiliate myself & hope. —
A great privilege it will appear to me if Smith travels with me
& look forward to this journey with greatest delight, though
I fear M's absence will mar the pleasure. — Mond I walk
usually with dear Welter, Berge & Samb.

Friday 15 June 38. At dawn with Schwarz Kessler Ulr. God is more persecuted
but I had correctly exposed H.'s doctrine concerning Genl.
God is only an 2d Person, & becomes only unw. Person at the end.
The ruhige Seele which L. denies was called by Kessler a stille
Offenheit und pick, which requires it a moder parity. — It is
pretended that Logic is the power of God himself by which his
omnib. creating was effected, but it does not proceed from pure
intellectual basis. Nichts is nicht etwas, is taken from Erkenntnis
That Sein is hier we know only by turning our mind upon Erkenntnis

In the evening 2 lectures from 5-7, then walk with Smith from
Portland and Wissenborn from Meulenb. In him a very aspiring
soul and he stayed with a certain Mr Lane 1104 732

16. June Saturday morning at 11 walked with Edman. Question if he thinks that G.
applied the canon justly of the übergründet Subject. He said yes.
For H. puts creation at the end of Logic, is result of die absolute
Gottheit welche die Welt an sich enthält. Die Welt kommt zumal in
System vor, als die Incorporation der Idee und als das Werk des drei-
migen Gottes. - Das Nichts ist nicht das Nicht etwas sondern das Nicht. Das

Dieckhoff, at four with Ulrich & Smith. Felt unhappy for not having
had a being obliged to look through 3 Examiners of Wagner
Themen Militzel, had to address the ladies with my sister, in the
evening at Wilkes, addressed them in the presence of Miss Oudem,
glad that I found such an opportunity of seeing Nietz

18. 19. June Munday rose with the apprehension of not getting ready. As Ulrich had
spoken to me of Stamm's success at me I sent to Anton, but en vain.
Examined at 8, at 11 walk with Nietz & Oregg, at 4-5 fight with
old Fr. to exclude give German from Liebm a repulse, to
not have been so as to Themen to 3. Happy result. This
made me merry, walk with Schulze from Lorenz & Hastig
from Lengens, the former assured me that upon the whole
he spoke favourably of me, which revived me

Merry. In the evening at supper Ngemann & Koschnick.

Tuesday 19 June 38 I walked with Kaise who is a very nice intelligent youth of good breeding & with the Lamprecht & Wächter. In the evening quite a circle as of old, the presence of such old ~~old~~ champions as Kredschl, Häsel, Bröhmer, Kirchner enlivened the conversation, also some new ones as Saathwächter, Holtmeyer etc., about 26

Wednesday 20 June 38 After dinner received Stn & read quietly on in good humour till I met this injustice, it made me sick in the stomach & - now Schmideler letter about Paul arrived. I was able to gather courage & strength, but still it produced a bad night. However I was able in the evening reviv, at which Weise & Kord were present, to pronounce firm faith. I learn more & more to consider all as transient, having lived already long enough to see that -

Friday
Thursday 21 June 38 Well now, that's remarkable! At 5 o'clock Ge. asks me: Do you know the allerneueste? Is Kg hat & Vocat. under searchnet. Is hais ja & Kg Hamireu etc. Well now, what is that? I am aware that something good never happened without preceding sorrows, but on the other hand also an evil never came alone, though I cannot consider Paul's behaviour as a first rank evil at least as yet. I have instantly written to Nicol. This day next year I shall here notice what that was, which as yet wrapped up in doubt may as well turn out as a great disaster as a great benefit, though I had been indulging the prospect of a vocation of Müller. - At dinner walked with Vockmar & Melzer of Brunswick. At 4 o'clock I had been talking with Braune from Cöthen. Last night I walked with Holtmeyer from Lezlenburg & took supper with Hildebrand & Braune from Halberst & Pöthme & good old Schwarze.

So I am well & apprehensive as to the future because Lücke will not come. The second sign
seen also Feb. 18. from here: now it was much less than it was at the time of the first sign.
Saturday 22 June 28 The more I think about it, the more unlikely it appears
to me that the call should have taken place without a sort of consent
from Lücke. Nic. has received his letter instantly, so that the case of
his having been absent is improbable. Not less improbable it is that
he should not have informed the minister, & finally improbable it
is that things should have had advanced so far as to render the
withdrawing of the call from the hands of the king impracticable.
So I yield more to hope than to fear.

Wednesday 26 June 28 Morning. Last evening again falling off of some
the number smaller & the only speaking members Kirchner, Krieger,
Anser, Schwen & a little Schabwiler, afterwards down on the lawn
with Hiss. Had received Nicol. letter that contained nothing,
but showing also that I need not be alarmed at evil consequences.
It is a pity to see Ruge rage in such a manner, it might
seem as if the zeal for picky of the period from 1817-1830
was something transient & the development of the
principle of Semler etc must continue

Tuesday 2 10 July 36. Sunday I preached at Mark 14., fullest church, Wick, Hicke, Thone
afternoon walk with Göschel, evening with Thone & two Hansenboys, Monday morning
with Ulmer, Amstutz, Elias, even. with Thone, Peller, supper Schuder from Stadel,
& Dyckhardt fr. Zee. I must confess that the whole course & winter much
greater disposition to joy, quietness of mind than in former days, perhaps
owing to better sleep & digestion. I had many very sweet hours, though
the letter from Rheinthal about Paul damped my spirits & gave me a
restless night, yet the next day I was quite in good spirits. I am
cherished by the prospect of the journey to Lücke or somebody like him.
Wednesd. morn. with Moraw King Appert, evening with Beck Kleeuwit from Lindeln. & Wesselsborn from
Munkeln., Thursd. with 11 with Volkmeier & Melzer from Dornsevic & Schulz & Schreiber, evening
with Bröller, Prange from Weisenz. Holzb. fr. Halberst., for supper Böhm from Buchst. &
Herr K. from Wittenb. (Squintins), took leave, satisfied as having prevailed upon Herr K. to leave
him into the net. That I must say there were scarcely at any time so many new ones
attracted as this remembrance, which is a good heaven. I am anxiously waiting for the letter from
Kierp, dreading the travelling and
