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Tholuck, August

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Friday Feb 4. 1842 At 11 walk with Petz & Hutter the Hungarians, heavy and dry to drag on a spiritual conversation under various groans. Fonk & S came walk with Stohman & Bilke from Friesland. How slow people get enlightened, the one has got a mild christian mind, the other a determined shrewd character. At 5 Janköbler & Niemeyer from Brunswick requested a walk, then Rückberg from Brunswick, then Richer from Meiningen borrowed Ullmann, then Weyner from Meiningen who turned a lawyer. In the eve. about 50. sent today the last index of Romans to the press. I am loth of life! The plan with the psalms smother one.

Friday 14 Feb. 42. In the evening Santo Drenkmaier, Holzmann Friedrich Leideler from Cothen, Leideler from Cothen, Deves Plessey Calcar. I was when they went glad to have engaged Caritas & Fischer to walk with me, also Simon.

Thursday 20 Feb 42. At 11 walked here with Simon, Braunshurg, Felmedt from Carlsruhe. Heard from Caracas having given up Diarmity, yesterday Böttiger borrowed Hegel, every where the influence of the system.

Wednesday 15 March 42. Just that moment leave for Hiding the Transylvanian, Scholz from Brunswick, Polhays, yesterday from Leidold Stinger. I have to mention that Wednesday a fortnight ago we had a most frequented meeting about 120, Galach's address, myself on 3. 33 with much fervor quite happy afterwards. I am all plunged into the prayer, this morning 74. Walked in the morning with Enke, Chwonne & maier fiscal of Mr. Marks, afternoon with Dr Thiele. At 5 o'clock I was in expectation if Hiding would bring along another Transylvanian, I am most thankful he did, he brought Kraus a fine lad.

Thursday 17 March 42 Walk with Schalle & Drenkmaier, evening with Pitze from Göttingen at Blanc's. Pain in the chest increased.

Friday Just now taken leave with deap woe from Sitzgrin, Enke, Harsen camp, understood that few books had been sold, received letters from Caracas who writes me.

Wednesday 4 May 42. The week in Berlin unusually happy. Health tolerable, from all sides kindness, honour chiefly from the minister, also love from Königst. Not having the drawback of a lady I could roughly arrange as I liked. Returned in the best mood, indeed those days belonged to the most happy days, after the return kindest love to my dearest wife sweet hours before the Lord, pleasant journey to Lyssie, where we dined with Hermott, Künchler, Kasel, Felsch, Lindner, Seppert.

The only regrettable, alarming incident was the drawback of M. in the matter of Schwarz & the Blackes, apprehension, rising from it. However some days after that also was gone by. At present after the commencement of the lecture a most pleasant easy feeling because I have so little to do. At 10 I lecture on Corinthians, twice on prophets, once parables. I have plenty of time for the Bible & my health is good. But alas - in the Cor. scarcely 40, New ones very very few a Mr Johannings from Glogau, a young lad recommended from Sagan who attended Weissenau a fine lad from Opppin, Mr Schwarz from Helstien, there are all of them. However if I was sure that the others have not more I should acquiesce & consider this somewhat as one of hisses. My eyes are indeed turned towards Scotland. 9 May 42 Missionary meeting, myself full of zeal, but today knocking almost with the lecture at the tolling mass & sedulousness of my existence. No new students, from the environs none at all, Quedlinb., Pforta all returned from me. In the Corinth shamefully say 40. However I am sick of feeling & thus for why file then pass with the counting of sickly feeling.

Friday 27 May 42 Very pleasant trip to Gnadau which refreshes me to this very moment, blessed sermon the second yesterday in St Moritz. The minister the emphasis of all, in the Cor. now perhaps 57, the new ones retire, I must walk day by day with old ones, not one enquire, that I can
