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a delicious country, Wetter at my side grumbling at his neck
understanding me very foolishly. Evening Faido, Kays sick,
W. Moxich, Lincoln the only one to converse with. Following
morning in delightful air & country. to Borghetto from whence
a carriage to Bellinzona, coffee, afternoon off to again a proof
that the most distressed situations terminate in the brightest
moments, hurrying on a thunder storm threatening behind,
through delightful regions till the foot of Genève, in all haste
on so as to leave breath till it was discovered that the mountain
was not to be ascended but that the road passed by the
summit. In Borro the abbe of Giovanni, dried at the fireside
my clothes, then at 10 o'clock finished upon the carriage
by under the skin of the moun, covered with a carpet, to Lugano
in the hotel Swizzero, where at 11 1/2 a sleepy boy showed me
the room the door of which opened upon the corridor all night.
Only the enormous sleepiness made me sink into sleep.
The morning took after 9 to Salvador. After the incident of
last days I could expect W. Moxich, but scarcely a
word & upon addressing him a coarse answer. While W. Moxich
spoke I gazed a little at the ridge alpine around
then turned the back & in black mood returned lonely to the
hotel, sat down at a dinner of 3 Banks & very quickly dear
Lincoln made his appearance. Oh how much I love that
narrow humerous intelligent being.

25 March 1843 First day of vacation. What noisy ~~off~~ Spach-
stunde, how many affectionate partings: Giesebricht, Holzmann
& Friedrich from Witten, Nichols from Musburg who was very feelingless,
Noël from Berlin, Pape from Hornsgorode, Lanz from Berlin, Wolf from
of Gesenius, Kursky. I tried to keep the former during the sunrise
crowd entered & left, till at last two Musburgs. & one Pravarian
entered & sat down, with them & Wolf & continued the discourse.
Such a blessed & influential semister I have never had before.

And in descending the Kambsberg with Wetter how did I express
any anxiety concerning the next Semester! Thus the Lord knows
to guide differently from what we expect! The great event
was however the death of Guertius which took away the lightning
from the hearts & the great number of youths who arrived
at the commencement of the session. There was no instance of
relapse of this session with the only exception of Nöl, on
the contrary Ramse drew nearer though yet cold, Rösler also
& even Richter requested again intercourse. Nevertheless I
closed the term with deep cutting woe, in consequence of
Winkler's coldness, I wished to be far from the scene
O Lord teach me to cleanse my heart, the day of my separ-
ation from this world is drawing nigh.

Sept 4th. 1843 Monday morning, before setting out for Mgd.

with the specimens from Mgd. & most enormous depression
on the nerves, today in better state of mind, but

eyes wear. I had a hard struggle concerning the choice of Faust but I approve now of my choice, he has not much understanding. I recollect how often he remained dumb in conversation & instead of giving a reply only a burst of laughter. My health was tolerable, few days of great lowness, on the contrary some of vigour. By the way that the Tiber. Dieder Wellman adopted so little grieves me, also Pete passed quite unaffectedly. How will mother do in Switz. I should say very well. I have a deep longing after my wife, if she can love me, I love her ardently, & the company will be pleasing.

I have not been thus looking up in all periods of my life. all
the spots of the earth always gleaming always unfulfilled
& she thought the same. When I said. Sure all is gone
& here we are grappling in the dust she replied: but

Nov. 1st. 43 Wednesday. First I have to record about my journey of Oct 18th Wednesday till Friday 20th my trip to Sandnitz, three of the happiest days of my life. I felt the necessity of some relaxation after having worked out the review on B. Cons. John. One of the most splendid days we sat out, first a camp
 Ahrens? by Enrico, having just conversed intelligently with him on Camoens it was like Dumbarton when he left us & I approached bed-ridden, but not at all. As I arrived, withdrew for a hour to that family then returned. That is also to fine that he is not like Wicks who had so many other people to deal with, he is totally given to my self. After having retreated, we stole away upon the sofa some time, in the night I must drive him out. Next morning delightful talking, then out to Selitzsch, Grossman etc. Dinner with Hütner right, Messner left, Volkmar, Messner, Grossm. Del., after hard walk with Del. Caspari, Grossm. Emil. Evening alone with T. Next morn. wet & violent storm, with closed eyes but so fresh as to ring true, — had we also walked back? the few moments after dinner we walked in the field I felt the bias of becoming, almost he had broken my arm. Fresh full of time all the subsequent days till Monday at Magd. where I had that enormous grievance of calling Brox. a ~~romanticist~~. I could scarcely manage myself, hurried home & consulting Weyss, who lay happily unfolded. — Last Wednesday, Friday Monday at 8 walked with T., yesterday with him & Th. to Wehrin. She called me you, I addressed him freely then. On the way there I felt quite dull & fallen, but back in the most sumnerly moonshine evening, unapologetically happy. Also in the morning there was no reason of yielding to the feeling that I am not encompassed enough by love, I feel that I am encompassed by him as much as I require it. That relieves me together with my dear wife's love. — Today began lecture, though had right,
