Now could we see that incomprehensible condescension of Gods love to usward, if we were not thoroughly convinced of our undeservedness. Our duty consists (1) carefully to avoid giving him cause to withdraw, (2) when our mind is dark and overcast, think it a distress a cry to him that can deliver (3) think on deliverys past and trust to him, that is of no changing temper.
