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Amor descendit, non ascendit. This is a sign of its heavenlyness, Benefactors generally love their Clients better, than the Clients their Benefactors. It is the nature of Love, $\therefore$ if it be not a Bastard or Counterfeit Love, it rather to give than to receive. The Sun sends down his Beams to the lowermost parts of the earth, our streams which are thereby raised reach but a very little way up towards heaven. The more refined vapours get up highest and gathering into clouds afford fruitful rain, whereas the thick stinking fogs infect the air with unwholesome quality.
