At a numerous Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, held in the Church this 12th of December 1792, in consequence of public Notice given for the purpose of collecting the unbiased Sentiments of the Parishioners on the present state of public Affairs.

HUMPHRY BACHE, Esq; in the Chair.

Resolved Unanimously,
THAT the Parishioners of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, now convened together, do publicly Avow and Declare their inviolable Attachment to the Constitution of this Country, as established at the Revolution.

Resolved Unanimously,
That this Meeting are deeply Impressed with the invaluable Blessings which arise from the Protection of the Law, and from the freedom of the British Government, manifested by a degree of prosperity in the Improvement of the Arts and the increase of Commerce and Manufactures beyond what any other Nation enjoys.

Resolved Unanimously,
That for the purpose of preserving these invaluable Blessings, this Meeting are determined to exert every endeavour which shall have a tendency to strengthen and support the Executive Power, and particularly at this Important Crisis when Republicans and Levellers have been deluded into attempts to produce Anarchy and Confusion.

Resolved Unanimously,
That the Inhabitants of this Parish now convened will unite in one determination, firmly and strenuously to support the civil Magistrates whenever any occasion shall require their Interference in suppressing Tumults and Disorder, and also in preserving Peace and Tranquillity by their efforts which shall prevent the public mind from being poisoned and disturbed by the Circulation of Artful and Seditious Writings.

Resolved Unanimously,
That these Resolutions be transcribed fairly into a Book to be signed by each Member of the Meeting now present, and that the said Book shall be kept open in the Vestry-Room until the Evening of Saturday next for the Signature of such other Inhabitants of the Parish as have not been able to attend the present Meeting to sign the same.

Resolved Unanimously,
That for the Information of the Inhabitants who are now absent these Resolutions shall be printed and published in the Daily Papers.
